The night shift

Scared and battered, she landed in a place where she got more than good care. She was prescribed a new life



I grew up in a very conflicted home. There was a lot of "church stuff," but behind closed doors there was a lot of abuse. I didn't connect with my parents or any of my six siblings on any sort of spiritual or emotional level. The only really good memories I have are those of the summers I spent at my grandmother's house in Vancouver, Canada.

At age 9, I started cutting myself as a form of coping in order to not deal with the insanity in my head. By age 13, I was hanging out with older men in a gang and getting involved in all the wrong things. I was drinking and doing drugs very soon after. Drinking turned off the voices in my head that had been telling me my whole life that I was different or not good enough for anyone.

When I was 14, I was raped by a man 17 years older than me. We continued to have a very sick and painful relationship for the next four years. When I was 16, I became pregnant by him. At 23 weeks into the pregnancy, he physically abused me and dropped me off at a nearby hospital.

My son died and I had numerous fractures and intensive internal injuries. I was kept in the ICU for a full week and in the regular hospital unit for another week.

And that is where I met my first sponsor. She had 22 years of sobriety in AA at the time and was my nurse in the hospital. She saw that I needed help and knew just how to give it to me. She told me about AA, read the Big Book to me after her shifts, showed me how to pray and loved me when I didn't know that was possible.

When I was released from the hospital, she took me home with her. I slept on her couch for a few weeks and went to a meeting every day with her. I would love to say that I stayed sober, but as is true for many of us, I relapsed. I drank for another four years.

When I was 20, I found out I was pregnant again. I knew I didn't want to harm another child, but I also knew I couldn't stay sober with my insane, overwhelming thoughts. So I went into treatment and then went right back into the rooms of AA. That was 2005. I have been sober since that date and I pray that I will continue to be.

After treatment, I called that nurse who had shown me another side of life years earlier. I asked her to continue sponsoring me. We worked the Steps and I learned more about myself than I ever thought was possible.

Coming into the rooms at such a young age seemed odd to some people. But I felt a sense of peace and love from those old-timers who I met, and I clung onto every word they said. I did what they asked me to do and I let them love me until I learned to love myself. They became my family. A few are even like adoptive parents, really. They never judged me. They always encouraged me or put me in my place when I was wrong. They always welcomed me with open arms, no matter what.

My sobriety has not been easy. Being so young when I got sober meant I still had a lot of life struggles to deal with, and I had to deal with them sober. The rooms, meetings, people, the Big Book, my Higher Power and my passion for this program are what have gotten me through. I have no doubt in my mind that I would not make it through life if I ever left.

My sponsor has since passed away, but I was able to watch her end life with 35 years of sobriety. I was able to show her that the work she was doing was working, since I had nine years of sobriety at the time. If it weren't for her reaching out her hand to me and caring for me in that hospital when I was just 16, I would not have been able to do what I can do today.

I am a single mother of four beautiful children and I have an insane amount of responsibilities, working two jobs and attending nursing school. I still go to numerous meetings a week, pray every day, read the Big Book to new women and sponsor them, as I love the ones still struggling, just like those old-timers loved me.

In recent months Ogden IGCO (Intergroup/Central Office) has fielded multiple questions regarding a group's ability or choice to participate in the 7th Tradition of Self-Support, as it regards Alcoholics Anonymous as a whole, locally and nationally. The editor has included the following excerpts from AAWS (AA World Service) Literature in an effort to provide explanation.

This information accompanies the 2019 Annual Donations Summary, **(which follows on the next page)**.

(All of this information regarding the AA Group's 7th Tradition is available at no-charge at Ogden IGCO or can be obtained online at www.AA.org.)

Self-Support: 7th Tradition

After the group's basic needs are met, such as providing for rent, literature, refreshments, and insurance, the group can participate in the financial support of the Fellowship as a whole by sending money to various A.A. service entities:

1) their local intergroup or central office; **2)** their area and district; and **3)** the General Service Office. These entities use contributions in a number of ways, always with the aim of carrying the A.A. message to the alcoholic who still suffers

Do all groups contribute to A.A.'s service entities?

No. Contributions are strictly voluntary and some groups simply cannot afford additional contributions after covering their basic needs. Additionally, there are groups who, for whatever reasons, choose not to be a part of the self-support network. These groups, nevertheless, will receive basic services from the district, area and intergroup if they wish, and are welcome to list with G.S.O., where they will receive the same basic services as other groups.

In 2017 the percentage of all listed groups who contributed to G.S.O. was 43.7%, in 2016 it was 41.5%.

a. February Area Committee Meeting: Held the 4th Saturday in February.

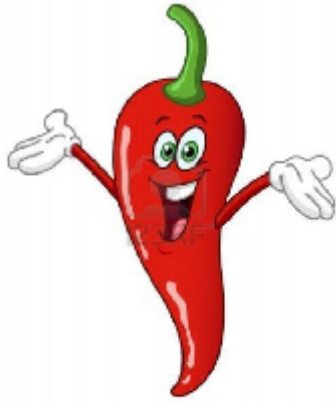
