This Old House

There's a man here in my town who has been sober for more than twenty years. He is middle-aged and has never been married. He has friends with whom he shares and plays golf, but for some reason, he isn't sure that they love him. He has been my friend for seventeen years.

My friend has recently had a horrible few years. Health problems have plagued him and his wonderful companion, his dog, died. He was then diagnosed with cancer and had to go to a neighboring city for chemotherapy and radiation.

When one of his friends went by to see how he could help out, he found that the man had completely let his house go. It was a torn-up mess. It was sad to think of his friend returning to this house to recuperate. He put the call out to other friends in the Fellowship, and in three days they did a basic remodeling job. Plumbing was fixed, floors were replaced, blinds were bought and mounted, rooms were painted, counters and appliances were cleaned, clothing, curtains, and linens were washed and ironed, new sheets and pillows were provided, and the bed was made up. Those who could not donate time and talent donated money.

This story touches me so deeply because at one point in sobriety I was the alcoholic who was physically ill. I wanted to isolate and become a hermit as our friend did. I could actually visualize myself lying on the couch, wrapped in a blanket, never going outside again for the rest of my life. This was with several years of sobriety under my belt. Luckily, I am married and my husband wouldn't allow me to do this, but it very well could have been me living without hope.

This man will go home on Monday. None of us will be there to see his face when he arrives home. We suspect he will be embarrassed that we saw his house the way it was; and we hope he will then be grateful. The sad part of this story is that this man had been around us every day and none of us knew how much he was suffering. I pray that I will become more aware of the people around me and how I can be of service to them.

I am grateful that I got sober in a generation of AA where old-timers preached unselfishness and service to God and our fellows. I am grateful that God has helped me find my way to decent employment so that I could contribute financially to this project. All the people who were involved will surely reap the benefits of this act of love. These things happen every day in the Fellowship. This is the story of Alcoholics Anonymous.

Tradition Nine:

AA, as such, ought never be organized; but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.

3. Do I try to understand and use all elements of the AA program– even if no one makes me do so–with a sense of personal responsibility?

4. Do I exercise patience and humility in any AA job I take?

- 5. Am I aware of all those to whom I am responsible in any AA job?
- 6. Why doesn't every AA group need a constitution and bylaws?

7. Have I learned to step out of an AA job gracefully—and profit thereby—when the time comes?

8. What has rotation to do with anonymity? With humility?
