The Conference Process

A member in Florida shares their thoughts about how the Conference works and the best way to use it

Some years ago, I was privileged to be elected by my home group to serve as their GSR (general service rep). And so began my extensive study of the *A.A. Service Manual* and the book *A.A. Comes of Age*. I had imagined it would be very dry reading, but was surprised and delighted to have many spiritual experiences as I read those pages.

Just as so many of us believe that our Big Book was divinely inspired, so too was the engineering of our Conference structure. But sadly, I find few members of our Fellowship really know or understand how to tap into this process.

I had lunch today with several other AA women, all sober many years. I shared with them what my service sponsor explained to me. If we want to see change in AA, we first need to get the support of our home group behind us. Then, when we speak, we will be speaking for many instead of one.

We all hear ideas for improvement from different members all the time, whether it be a need to update a pamphlet, add new literature or publish new videos. It pains me greatly when members simply turn to literature published by other companies, instead of utilizing the tools AA already has, and keep our money and our finest resources here in AA.

What most members don't realize is that if they bring a good idea up at their home group business meeting and the group conscience supports the idea, their GSR can take that opinion to their district meeting and present it to the other GSRs. They, in turn, can take it back to *their* home groups to discuss. At the next district meeting, a group conscience of the district can be taken. If that's favorable, the DCM (district committee member) can share the idea with other DCMs to report to their districts for consideration or wait and report it at the area assembly. Everyone present at the assembly can take it back to their home groups for consideration and a vote.

At the next area assembly the GSRs can bring back the voice of their home groups about this idea. If the area approves it, the area delegate then sends the proposal to the General Service Conference

(GSC) for consideration. The GSC can send the idea back through all the delegates to all areas throughout the U.S. and Canada. Now all home groups connected to the service structure have a chance to consider this idea and send their decisions back through the structure. At the next GSC, the idea will be considered and voted on.

For instance, if a piece of literature is approved, a directive will be sent to the Trustees Literature Committee to make it happen. It may have to go back to the Fellowship for approval before publishing, but AA World Services will eventually publish this Conference-approved literature. This work then will truly be the voice of all AA and not just a few members.

This is a lengthy process, but a powerful one. Shortcuts are often taken. A GSR can take their group's opinion on an idea directly to the area assembly and report it. But then they are representing only one home group in one district. Some GSRs may take that idea back to their home groups to discuss, but others might not. An individual member can even write directly to GSO and make a request. If worthy, that request may make it to the trustees committee. But if it's only one AA's opinion, it might not be a very compelling request.

When we use the Conference structure process, the voice of the Fellowship is louder and more powerful and will definitely be heard. By using this process, we help ensure that the Fellowship of AA always holds the final responsibility and ultimate authority for all of AA's world services.

When sorely perplexed, the group inevitably turns to them for advice. They become the voice of the group conscience; in fact, these are the true voice of Alcoholics Anonymous. They do not drive by mandate; they lead by example.

This is the experience which has led us to the conclusion that our group conscience, well-advised by its elders, will be in the long run wiser than any single leader.

① OPENING:

Mike R. called the meeting to order at 7:00pm with a moment of silence, followed by the Serenity Prayer. The GSR Preamble was read followed by the 12 Traditions. Roll call and the contributions basket were passed around at this time. Sam P. presented the April Meeting Minutes, which were reviewed and a motion to accept was raised. The district body voted to accept the meeting minutes.

- **Corrections Chair** - Bob Y. reported all is well. There will be some adjustments to how the Weber County Jail meetings are handled to verify no inmates are accessing jail equipment. No inmates were allowed to during an A.A. meeting, but a situation occurred with another outside organization so our volunteers will be caught up to date with the new policies.

- **Intergroup Logan** - Mike A. shared that the Chili Cookoff was a big success. Intergroup Logan is now preparing for their July 11th summer event. Save the date as there is more information on its way!
- **Intergroup Ogen** - Mike L. shared that April was a busy month for the central office! There are vacancies on the steering committee that need filled if you are looking for a service position.

- **Treasury Report** - Judy Y. shared the previous month's treasury report. Jon W. asked if the contributions this year were trending as they had in previous years. Judy advised that she would review and provide more information next month. The matter of our District balance was reviewed again. Mike A. advised that Logan Intergroup had an excess of money they almost distributed, but were glad they did not as some unforeseen expenses and lack of contributions ended up popping up requiring them to dip into their prudent reserve.

③ DCM and DCMC Reports

 - This concept shows us the value in the minority opinion. Bill Wilson tells us that the well-heard minority is our chief protection against an uninformed, misinformed, hasty or angry majority. We see this concept exercised regularly within our Area Assemblies and District Meetings where one individual may raise a concern with the way the rest of the body is voting, and ultimate sway the vote of another individual within the majority. As soon as one vote is swayed the entire body must conduct a revote to verify that the outcome is truly in the best interest of A.A. as a whole.

Quiet time is 12:00 am - 7:00 am. Your consideration is appreciated.

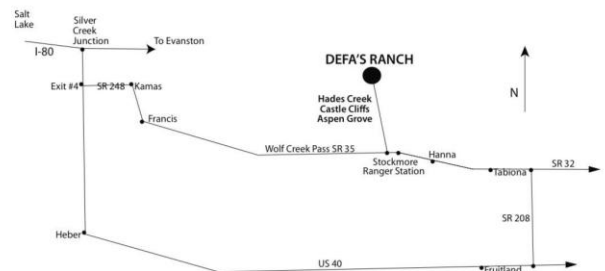
No ATVs, Trail Bikes or Bicycles allowed in camp area.

Parking in designated area only. **No firearms/fireworks allowed on the Ranch.**

How to get there:

Via Wolf Creek Pass: Take 1-80 from Salt Lake to Silver Creek Junction US 40 (just past Park City). Take the Park City/Kamas exit (#4) and turn left to Kamas about 11 miles on SR 248. Turn right on SR 32 (by Texaco gas station) and go to Francis (about 2 miles) Turn left at the 4 way stop onto SR 35 this is the road to Wolf Creek Pass. After you pass mile marker 32 (look for blue sign) turn left on the first road you come to. About a 1/2 mile past the 3rd National Park campground (Hades Creek), you'll see Defa's Ranch on the left.

Via US 40: Take I-8 from Salt Lake to Silver Creek Junction US 40 (just past Park City), through Heber to Fruitland, continue for about 5 miles and turn left on HWY 208 for 10 miles, then turn left on SR 32, through Tabiona and Hanna. After you pass mile marker 33 (look for blue sign) turn right on the first road you come to. About a 1/2 mile past the 3rd National Park campground (Hades Creek), you'll see Defa's Ranch on the left.
